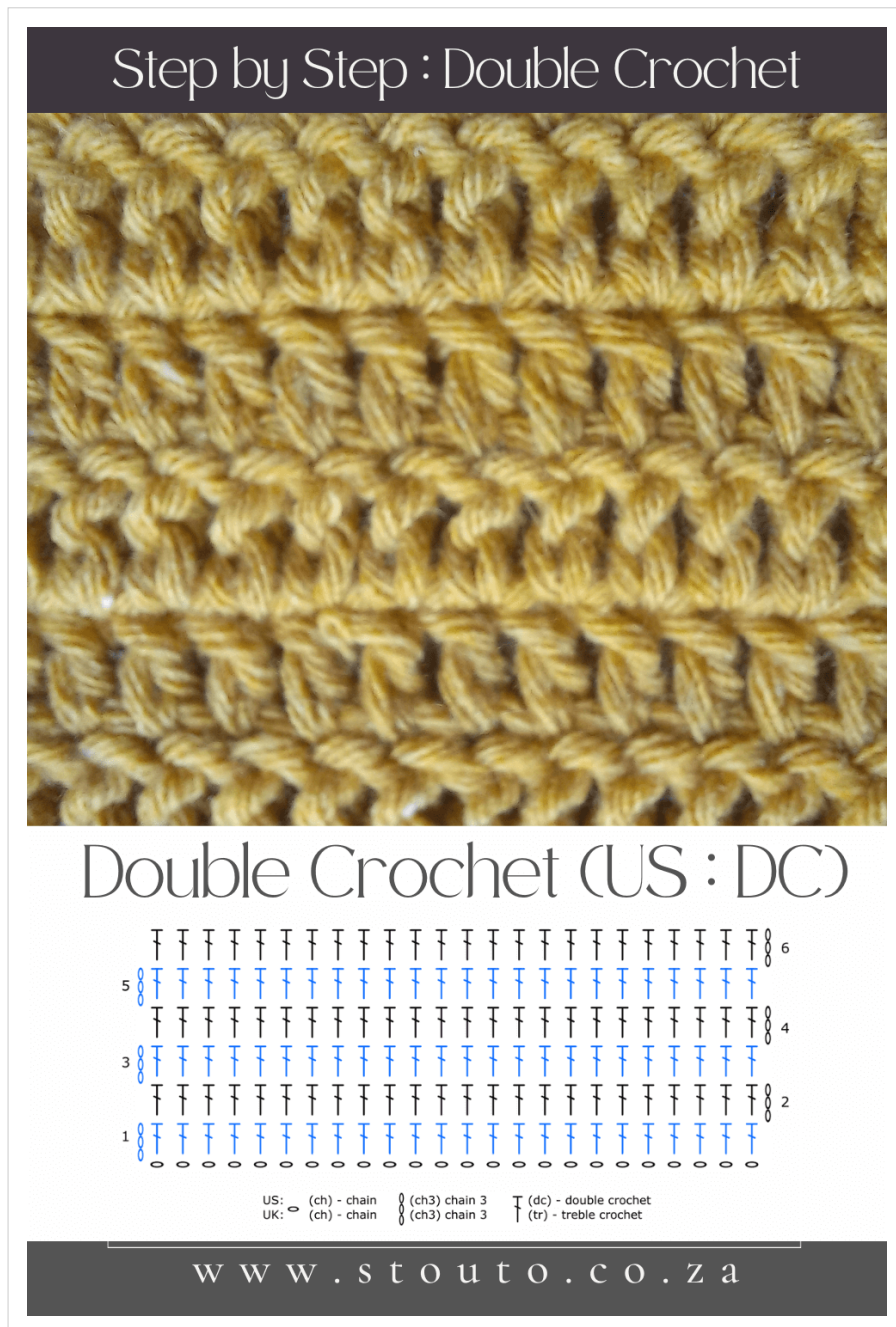


Double Crochet



Double Crochet

The double crochet stitch is one of the most widely used stitches in crochet, known for its taller height and versatility. In US terms, it is called DC, while in the UK it is referred to as Treble (TR). This stitch creates a fabric that is lighter and more open than single or half double crochet, making it ideal for blankets, scarves, shawls, and lacy patterns.

Double crochet is often used in textured patterns, shell stitches, and decorative designs, making it an essential stitch for beginners who want to expand their skills and create more varied projects.

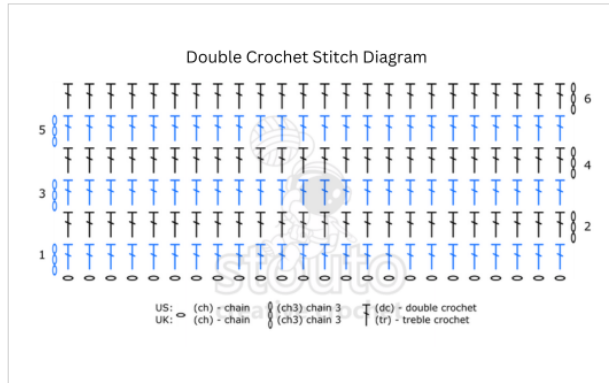
Beginner's Guide to the Double Crochet Stitch (US: DC, UK: TR)

The double crochet stitch (DC) is one of the most popular and versatile stitches in crochet. It's taller than the single and half double crochet stitches, creating a soft and flexible fabric that works beautifully for blankets, garments, and accessories. If you want a quick-working stitch that adds height and drape to your crochet projects, the DC stitch is a must-learn!

What Is a Double Crochet Stitch?

The double crochet stitch, abbreviated dc, is a tall stitch that gives your fabric an airy, open look. It's twice as tall as a single crochet, which means your projects grow faster with fewer rows.

In UK crochet terms, the double crochet stitch is known as a treble crochet (tr) stitch.



Abbreviation

Crochet Stitch Method

1. Yarn over.
2. Insert hook into stitch, pull up a loop (3 loops).
3. Yarn over and pull through first 2 loops (2 remain).
4. Yarn over and pull through last 2 loops.



Step by Step

Step-by-Step Instructions

1. Start with a foundation chain of the desired length.
2. Yarn over (wrap the yarn over your hook).
3. Insert your hook into the 4th chain from the hook (US) or 3rd chain (UK: TR).
4. Yarn over and pull up a loop (three loops on hook).
5. Yarn over and pull through the first two loops on the hook (two loops remaining).
6. Yarn over and pull through the remaining two loops.
7. Repeat across the row.
8. Turn your work at the end of the row and continue DC into each stitch across subsequent rows.

UK Equivalent

In the UK, double crochet is called Treble (TR). The technique is the same; only the naming differs between regions.

Beginner Tips

- Keep tension consistent; DC is taller than SC and HDC, so uneven tension can create wavy edges.
- Use a larger hook for practice to make it easier to pull loops through multiple stitches.
- Count stitches carefully to avoid adding or skipping stitches.
- Practice turning chains consistently, as DC requires more height than SC or HDC.
- Compare swatches to see the difference in fabric openness compared to SC and HDC.

Common Mistakes

- Forgetting the initial yarn over before inserting the hook.
- Pulling the loops too tight, making the fabric stiff.
- Uneven stitch height, causing wavy edges.
- Skipping or adding extra stitches, affecting row consistency.
- Miscounting turning chains when joining rows.

Common Uses

- Blankets, throws, and afghans
- Scarves, shawls, and cowls with more drape
- Shell, ripple, and lace patterns
- Combining with other stitches to create texture and decorative motifs

Crochet Stitch Practice Example

Practice Row Example

Here's a quick practice exercise:

1. Chain 15 (this gives you 13 working stitches plus 2 for turning).
2. Yarn over and insert your hook into the fourth chain from the hook.
3. Work one double crochet stitch.
4. Continue making DC stitches across the row (you'll have 12 double crochet stitches).
5. Chain 3 and turn your work to begin the next row.

Repeat this process to make a small sample, notice how tall and open the stitches look compared to single or half double crochet.



The double crochet stitch is essential for creating taller, more open fabrics, giving beginners the ability to make a wide range of projects with fluidity and texture. With consistent practice, attention to tension, and careful stitch counting, beginners can confidently use DC in combination with other stitches to create complex, professional-looking crochet designs, from dense blankets to lacy scarves.
