Understanding the Solomon's Knot Stitch

The Solomon's Knot stitch forms open diamond-shaped loops connected by single crochet stitches. The key feature of this technique is the adjustable loop size—by varying the length of each loop, you can control the openness and drape of your finished fabric.

It's often used in lacy garments, market bags, or as decorative borders. The stitch creates a balanced blend of texture and transparency, making it ideal for projects that need a delicate touch.

Abbreviation

Crochet Stitch Method

1. Yarn over and pull a large loop (size of loop = spacing).
2. Insert hook into loop, yarn over, pull through loop, chain 1 to secure.
3. Repeat to form long lacy loops; later rows single crochet into loops.

Step by Step

Step-by-Step Instructions (US Terms)

Foundation:

Start with a slip knot and chain 2.

Step 1:

Pull the working loop on your hook up to about 1 cm (or the desired loop size).

Yarn over and draw through the loop to make a long chain.

Step 2:

Insert your hook under the back strand of that long loop, yarn over, and pull up a loop (2 loops on hook).

Yarn over and pull through both loops — this completes one Solomon's Knot.

Step 3:

Repeat Steps 1 and 2 for the next knot.

Step 4:

Once your foundation row of knots is complete, chain 1, turn your work, and work a single crochet into the center of each knot



(the small space formed under the back strand).

Continue building rows of Solomon's Knots and single crochets until you reach your desired length.

UK Equivalent

In UK terms, the Solomon's Knot is created the same way, but where the US uses single crochet (SC), UK crocheters will use double crochet (DC) to secure each loop. The rest of the process—elongating loops and working through their strands—remains identical.

Beginner Tips

- Maintain consistent loop size: Use a ruler or your thumb as a guide until you develop a feel for it.
- Keep a light tension: Tight loops will lose the stitch's lacy charm.
- Block your finished piece: This opens up the knots and enhances the lace texture.
- Mark your row ends: The loops can be hard to see, so stitch markers help you stay aligned.
- Use smooth yarn: It helps the loops glide easily and shows the openwork beautifully.

Common Mistakes

- Uneven loop lengths: Leads to inconsistent spacing in your fabric.
- Twisting loops: Causes the pattern to lose its diamond-like structure.
- Skipping the securing single crochet: Without it, the knots unravel easily.
- Working too tightly: Reduces drape and makes it harder to work into subsequent rows.
- Losing your loop count at row edges: The stitch pattern can become uneven if you don't track loops carefully.

The Solomon's Knot stitch is known for its soft drape and airy appearance. It's perfect for:

- Shawls and wraps : elegant and lightweight.
- Summer tops or cover-ups: breathable and stylish.
- Decorative scarves : with color changes or gradient yarns.

Practice Swatch Exercise

1. Chain 2 to begin.
2. Make 8-10 Solomon's Knots for your foundation row.
3. Turn, and work one single crochet into the center of each knot.
4. Repeat for 3-4 rows to practice your loop size and row alignment.

For visual learners, try using contrasting yarns or a larger hook to clearly see the loop connections.
